We are seeking teachers of any subject matter, who are life-long learners interested in cultivating creativity in their classrooms. Participants in our Teaching for Creativity Institute will experience a 4-day, participatory immersion into ideas and practices for fostering creativity. Throughout the subsequent school year, educators will collaborate with one another, with master teachers, and with outside experts during 3, single-day workshops designed to support them in being effective and inspiring agents for creativity in their own classrooms and schools.

Past presenters have included education and creativity experts from Ashland University, the Ohio State University, Harvard University, and the PAST Foundation, as well as artists, designers, and master teachers.

The Institute is co-designed by CMA Learning Department staff and central Ohio master classroom teachers.

The Institute is open to all teachers. Cost of the program is \$425 per teacher, \$325 per teacher in a school team of 2 or more, and \$295 for teams that include administrators. Three Ashland University graduate credits are available for a special, reduced rate.

Early acceptance deadline is Friday, April 7; final deadline is Friday, May 5.
