





The Garden Shop, a beloved Showcase tradition, returns this year – pick up an annual or perennial at the front entrance of the museum as a sweet memento of your visit (Saturdays and Sundays, 11:00am–3:00pm). And don't pass up the opportunity to discover your own new treasures to take home at Treasures & Trinkets, located inside Showcase and open every day April 19 – May 19. This year's Designer Showcase ticket also grants you admission to the special exhibition *Life in the Age of Rembrandt: Dutch Masterpieces from the Dordrecht Museum*.

John Wilson's team designed this room with an updated nod to 1970's chic style. Our room inspiration began with a fabulous faux agate wall covering. Our wall covering is mesmerizing, with the pattern of a structured mineral and provides a dramatic backdrop as our focal point of the room. Enhancing the wall covering are custom walnut columns which are adorned with opulent oversized sconces, holding elongated mirrors. The carved wood frame of the bed is upholstered with a channeled pattern of opulent velvet, and flanking the bed are sculptural bachelor chests. Acrylic and metal benches sit at the foot of the bed and are topped in lush faux fur. Opposite the bed resides a geometric credenza against the wall of windows, which is then accented by two oversized chairs with an unexpected delicate iron base. The walls are a dramatic black/green that sets off this swanky throwback look. With accents of brass decor, velvets, and a rich color palette this room encompasses all that is 70's chic, resulting in an opulent and trippy experience.

The Dutch Master – at once time-bound to an era of formality – and timeless, lending a sense of repose to an environment for study, reflection or relaxation. All elements of the den speak to the balance Fritz seeks in combining unexpected materials, forms and finishes - the character of the ancient and irreplaceable harmoniously coexisting with contemporary palettes, furnishings and materials. The design re-interprets the representational still life and portrait in abstract, modernist planes and lines. To ground the space is the monumental slab of Cambria framed in rusticated wood, offset by gilded books. Contrasted with this heft is the lightness of almostfloating Poltrona-Frau furnishings. Just as with the Jan Brueghel still life and the Ferdinand Bol portrait, close examination rewards the viewer. Masterful stitching details in the Italian leather and Maharam felt echo the exacting brush-strokes that create suffused contours and ethereal light - the ideal subjects for a contemplation space.



This is where I started this journey. I imagined a big modern house with many large rooms. Off one side of the kitchen, a formal vintage style dining room, and off the other, the great room. I wanted to achieve a very warm and cozy environment where one might sit and read a Credits: book by Joan Didion or maybe even listen to an old vinyl LP by Sarah Vaughan or Chet Baker. I decided to offset the natural wood-colored floors with warm black walls and a bright white ceiling. The fabrics I chose are classic Ralph Lauren wool flannels ranging in colors from medium to charcoal grey. The mindset was less is more, mixing classic vintage shapes and objects. Everything in the room has its place. Alongside the general sitting area, an old round Biedermeier table sits in a satin black finish. The table is surrounded by dark metal armchairs with black decorative linen cushions. 





This kitchen is based around mixing and layering textures to add interest to the space. We stated with the dramatic ombre faux finish paint from black to white. The next step was using 3 different cabinet finishes to add depth to design. First by grounding the whole space with a dark charcoal island and topping it with a matte marble looking quartz Cambria top. The main focus in the kitchen is a grand looking hood that has a brushed brass band wrapped along the bottom. This is a metal accent that you will find throughout the whole design. To add another layer of texture, there are the 2 different types of wood: quarter sawn white oak and distressed maple. We find by combining all these fixtures and finishes we have created a living comfortable space, that translates beyond just one style. That's why we call it "beautiful, bold, blended design"




